





Sustainable writing instruments for both teachers and pupils

More than a philosophy, the Pilot 'WRITE BETTER WITH LESS' principle represents our approach, which is aimed at reducing the ecological impact of our production while preserving the standards of quality and innovation in our writing instruments.

At Pilot, we aim to constantly innovate while sustainably limiting our impact on the planet. Transforming our pens to make them ever more eco-friendly is a genuine technological and human feat. We're continuing to refine our efforts and improve our standards via an action plan based on four essential pillars – our '4R's of 'Recycle', 'Reduce', 'Refill' and 'Reclaim'.

RECYCLE – Limiting our use of plastic to a strict minimum. The extraction of raw materials needed to produce plastic represents 77.8% of a pen's carbon footprint, which is why, since the 2006 introduction of the Pilot Begreen range, we have preferred to use recycled plastic to make our pens.

REDUCE – We're all wrapped up in using less plastic. Since 2010, we have reduced quantities of virgin plastic by over 80% by using recycled plastic and FSC-certified cardboard. In 2020, we went even further. Our Begreen range is now available with 100% recyclable cardboard packaging.

REFILL – Change the refill, not the pen. Over 60% of our

products are refillable, which has enabled our end users to rethink how they consume. Using the same product several times, instead of throwing it away, is a gesture that's simple, economical and ecological.

SUSTAINABLE . ECONOMICAL . INNOVATIVE . QUALITY

RECLAIM – Less plastic in our oceans to reduce pollution. In partnership with the recycling

company TerraCycle, Pilot is adding reclaimed ocean waste to the recycled PET material used to manufacture the Iconic B2P range.

NEED -



Back in 2006 we launched our Begreen range – eco-designed products that are 85% refillable and manufactured with a minimum of 70% recycled plastic. This pioneering approach has allowed Pilot to become the first manufacturer worldwide to offer more environmentally-friendly writing instruments.



B2P – from Bottle to Pen! In 2021, for the first time anywhere in the world, we began making use of plastic waste reclaimed from beaches in the composition of our B2P range. These pens are made of at least 86% recycled plastic bottles, of which 2.5% are recycled ocean plastic.

The world is changing, and design can help! V&A Innovate is an annual National Schools Challenge, asking Y7, Y8 and Y9 students at state-funded schools to work in teams to design a solution to a real-world problem.

Grounded in the V&A's collections and cutting-edge industry practice, V&A Innovate has been created with teachers and designers to equip young people at KS3 with the confidence and skills to develop solutions for real-world issues. V&A Innovate supports:

- 1. Developing interdisciplinary problem solving skills, creativity, critical thinking, collaboration and communication
- **2.** Celebrating and advocating for design and creativity in your school

We're asking students to follow human- and planet-centred design processes in response to one of three challenge themes inspired by V&A collections – with this year's themes being 'Restore', 'Play' and 'Sense'.

We would recommend planning for a minimum of six hours to deliver a project, and running it over a term of D&T lessons, over a day as a dedicated STEAM project or via an extracurricular club. Those teams chosen as finalists will then be invited to pitch their ideas in person to our expert judges at V&A South Kensington, London.

There is a wide range of free online resources to support delivery of the challenge that you can check out. Our teacher and student toolkits will guide you through the design process step by step, while our series of films and animations – made with input from designers and curators – will bring real-world design lessons into your classroom and help to inspire your students' own design ideas.








Holy Cross College introduced Smart Lockers to improve its library experience, free up staff time and provide accountability for students. The Diplomat[™] Pro allowed them to streamline their device management by replacing their manual laptop loaning with a self-service solution.



As an educational establishment, Holy Cross College has a long and rich history. Originally established in the late 1800s, Holy Cross has since been through quite the transformation, having seen a series of changes and developments over the years, ranging from major refurbishments to the introduction of transformative technologies.

LapSafe® met with the college's head of library, Jaqueline Ponka, to discuss some recent ways in which the library has been transformed – in part, following the adoption Smart Lockers provided by LapSafe®.



"We had 20 laptops that were held in a cabinet behind the desk here in the library, and manually issued them to students. They were very popular, but it ended up being a very physical job, since we were constantly issuing, returning, issuing and returning.

There always had to be two of us at the desk because it was so busy. If we left the desk to help a student, there would soon be a queue of students with laptops



waiting when we returned. This led to constant interruptions. It was extremely time-consuming and physically demanding, but that was how we operated for around eight years."

Where did the idea come from to finally look at automating the system?

"The library manager and I had been saying from early on that we'd like to have a self-service unit. I'd attended a JISC IT event a few years back, where I saw a self-service unit on display. Then, during the last academic year, we were asked if we'd like a self-service laptop unit to help in the library. To which I of course said, 'Yes please...'

It wasn't intended as a replacement for a member of staff by any means, and we've never looked at it like that. More as something that could physically help us, as manually loaning the laptops was hard work. We'd been asked if we could take more laptops by IT, and I'd had to say no because we couldn't physically cope. So when we were offered the self-service



option, I jumped at the chance!

Our IT Manager had attended BETT the year before, saw the Diplomat™ solution and brought back some LapSafe® brochures. He said it looked like a really good product, that it would integrate well with our Heritage library management system and seemed to do everything we wanted.

What advice would you give to other colleges thinking of automating their laptop loaning?

"Do it! I think the main advice is just to do it if you can, as it makes life so much easier. Talk to librarians at other colleges, and if possible, try to see it in action. Talking to someone you trust in the same position as you really helps.

If you're setting up a new system from scratch and don't loan out laptops already, I'd say go for an automated system straight away, rather than via the route we took of manual loaning first, which is hard work.

Make sure you have the space to later expand the service, as it *will* be popular – students will always want more laptops. We ourselves would be very happy to welcome visitors from any nearby colleges who might be interested in seeing how the system works here."


The UK's leading gynaecological cancer charity, The Eve Appeal, has launched the Know Your Body lesson plans on menstrual health, anatomy and HPV and cancer. Covering Key Stages 2 to 3, the programme also includes a set of introduction to female genital mutilation (FGM) lesson plans which have been designed in collaboration with the National FGM Centre and are split across Key Stages 1 to 3. All lessons follow a spiral curriculum, with links to the health and wellbeing topics of the PHSE Association's programme of study.

The lesson plans are all free to download and use. They equip schools and teachers with age-appropriate, interactive lesson plans that have been designed by specialists, and are easy to use and embed in class, following as they do the mandatory RSE duty, as well as the PSHE Association's standards for teaching.

The lesson plans are supplied in packs that contain guidance for teachers (which can be followed and/or adapted according to teachers' needs), a PowerPoint presentation, assorted activities and accompanying videos.

In a survey of over 1,000 young people recently conducted by the Sex Education Forum, only 35% rated the quality of their school's RSE as 'good' or 'very good', with 22% rating this as 'bad' or 'very bad'.

The Know Your Body lesson plans aim to foster prevention and plug the gaps in RSE for young people - knowing what's

normal for you, spotting when things aren't, and knowing when to seek help.

60 women and people with gynaecological organs are diagnosed with one of the five gynaecological cancers every day in the UK, yet awareness of them remains shockingly low, with just 2% of the population knowing all five gynaecological cancers - womb, ovarian, cervical, vulva and vaginal.

Since 2019, RSE has been a compulsory part of the curriculum for schools in England, including the topics of menstrual wellbeing and cancer screening. This is fantastic progress, but without dedicated funding or training,

schools are often left without the resources or expertise needed to teach these topics.

The FGM lesson plans are co-designed with the joint expertise of The Eve Appeal in gynae health, and the National FGM Centre in FGM prevention awareness and training. The government's statutory RSE guidance makes it compulsory for secondary schools to teach pupils about FGM and other harmful practices. While the duty to teach about FGM isn't mandatory for primary schools, we encourage all schools to teach about the topic at the earliest opportunity, from Key Stage 1, to identify and protect girls at risk earlier, and empower the next generation to speak out about the issue.


Know Your Body lesson plans have so far been piloted in 53 funded workshops held at some of the least-served schools in Greater London and Manchester, reaching over 1,100 young people.

Some key insights from the evaluation of the pilot's first phase include 88% of students reporting that their ability to name the internal gynae organs had improved, and 70% of students reporting that their understanding of how to keep gynae organs healthy has similarly improved.

78% of students reported possessing a better understanding of menstruation, while 62% of students felt they understood more about different period products. 60% of students further felt they knew more about what a 'normal period' looks and

feels like, with 78% reporting that they had improved their knowledge of how to keep healthy during a period.

An impressive 96% of students meanwhile felt their understanding of HPV to have improved, alongside 93% reporting that they understood better how HPV relates to cancer. 86% of students felt their understanding of the HPV vaccine options and choices available to them had improved, and 89% of students felt they now knew more about cervical screening.




