HOW WE JUDGED

From a host of nominations spanning six trade categories and covering learning, development and CPD across the early years, we compiled a shortlist of 36 worthy finalists.

- Our judges were asked to assess these finalists, taking into account effectiveness and value for money, as well as originality and accessibility. Where applicable, resources were put through their paces in real settings.
- At the end of the process, our judges picked a winner and two highly commended resources in each category.
