How we judged

What is Helicopter Stories?

Helicopter Stories is in theory a simple approach, based on the work of Vivian Gussin Paley. The practitioner sits with the child, listens to their story, and writes it down word for word. Once the story is finished, the child decides which character they would like to play, and the scribe takes a story from the next on the list.

“Towards the end of the session, the children gather together, ready to observe and take part in the stories of their peers. A simple stage is marked on the floor and the classroom is transformed into a theatre. **Trisha Lee (Princesses, Dragons and Helicopter Stories)**”
